Sourced from carefully selected vineyards in the Hawke's Bay, the oldest wine region in New Zealand, the Mud House Merlot is soft and medium-bodied. The palate is full of juicy plum and blackberry, spliced with mint, black pepper and warming aniseed spice, and the finish is long and generous. A perfect room-temperature-serving red, great with red meats and charred green vegetables, this is a wine you can stock up in and enjoy from now through winter and beyond, comfortably rewarding time in the cellar for the next 3 years.
